Dear Parents, Caregivers and Whānau,

Tēnā koutou katoa, Talofa, Kia Orana, Bula, Malo e lelei, Mauri, Taloha, Greetings. Welcome back to Term Three! We hope that you had a break with your whānau despite some wet and bleek weather!!

Theme

This terms theme is all about creating, exploring and performing! Our whakatauki is "Kia kawea tātou e te rēhia.. Let us be taken by the spirit of joy, of entertainment." Students will experience a range of opportunities to "Create, Explore and then Perform" in their classes and cultural groups. They will explore and describe dances from a variety of cultures and understand how cultural practices reflect and express people's customs and traditions. At the end of the term there will be a Year 5/6 concert for students to showcase what they have learnt throughout the term to their peers and whānau.. Our Kapa Haka, Samoan group and choir will all perform at this concert as well as in their class items as practice for Kelifest and Choir festival. This will be held on Wednesday 26th September (the last Wednesday of term) from 1.45-3.00pm.

Maths

Classes cover Measurement for their strand focus this term - looking at metric units of length, area, volume, capacity, temperature and time. We will also explore the concept of finding area and volume of shapes. The Number focus for the term is Addition, Subtraction and Multiplication.

Health and PE

The Health and Physical Education focus this term will continue from last term and involve a range of invasion type games and activities that will allow students to identify the pressures that can influence our interactions with other people.

Through this students will learn about and develop basic assertiveness strategies to manage these situations.



Our Garden to Table programme continues this term with a focus on foods from Asia. We are always looking for more Whānau members to come along and help out whether it be in the kitchen

- preparing and cooking food with the students, or in the garden - planting, watering, weeding or harvesting with the students! Let us know! Just a reminder it is really important that all students wear covered shoes, and have long hair tied back for their Garden to Table sessions. Please feel free to come along and join in with your child's class to experience first hand what it is all about!

The sessions run from 12.20-12.50pm, then there is a break for lunch and then they start again at 12.50 finishing at around 2.45pm.
