Review of minutes: The cultural dinner suggestion is being progressed. It will probably be held mid-year and funded through ARMS.

The minutes were accepted.

Did you know?: Michelle reminded all that Fia Fia Nightclub has applied for consent to operate in Glen Eden from 12pm to 3am, Mondays to Saturdays.
Submissions must be in by 18 March.

Gayle noted that submissions are being called for on the Waikumete Cemetery Management Plan and that there is an information day on Saturday at the Kelston Community Centre.
She also mentioned the new booklet being prepared by Friends of Waikumete, entitled "Whispers the Wind." Proceeds from this will go towards grave restoration. This Saturday, there is a community event involving grave cleaning at the cemetery, from 10am.
